
- Shared mobility Uber and Lyft, scooter and bikeshare

Phase III: Develop the Comprehensive Transportation Plan with a robust public participation program, Summer 2019 – Winter 2020


Phase I: Transportation Plan Baseline

- Goal: identify the previous plans and transportation recommendations for Baltimore and its neighborhoods



- Collect city and neighborhood plans
- Identify of recommendations from plans
- Create a mapping tool to show recommendations


Land Preservation, Parks and Recreation Pla

Phase I: Plan Mapping


The 99 adopted and accepted plans were mapped in GIS to show the plan boundaries.




