- □ Contract Terms: Three-Year Contract and Two (1) Year Renewals
- □ <u>Bus Purchase</u>: DOT will purchase 12 new 40' transit style buses in 2 phases of 6. The first set of 6 will arrive in late fall of 2019.
- □ <u>Bus Rehab</u>: Up to 1M Dollars has been set aside to rehab the existing city owned fleet to include: New Seats, Engine Replacement, Hybrid Battery, Body Repairs, and Paint.
- □ <u>Re-Branding Campaign:</u> In an effort to celebrate the up coming 10th Anniversary of the Circulator Service DOT will engage the public in a marketing campaign to rebrand the logo and slogan of the Circulator.
