Developing and Promoting a Comprehensive and Efficient Regional Transportation System Capable of Moving Goods, Services and the Workforce.



GBC LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES - 2021

- Advocate for balanced transportation and mobility policy and funding priorities that create interconnected multimodal transportation networks and promote equitable investments in systems across regions, modes and communities.
- Policymakers should strategically invest in interconnected multimodal transportation networks that actively contribute to economic growth, connect workers to employment and move people and goods safely and efficiently.



Advocacy

Engage in local, state and federal legislative advocacy to ensure the transportation network in Greater Baltimore Region is adequately funded and maintained to ensure safe operations and planning for future growth.



Advocacy

- Ensure funding at all levels is prioritized towards <u>Maintenance</u> and <u>Key Projects</u> that enhance workforce connections and economic growth.
- Urge additional state transportation funding for the Greater Baltimore Region and oppose efforts to disproportionately direct state dollars to other regions of the state.



Advocacy

- Ensure all capital and operating funding dollars are data-driven and examined through an equity lens.
- Advocate for consistent and adequate funding levels for MTA to ensure the safe and efficient operations of current system and reduce multibillion dollar backlog to maintain existing system in state of good repair.
 - Opposition to cuts to MTA in December 2020.
 - Passage of HB 114/SB 199- Transit Safety and Investment Act.



Central Maryland Regional Transit Plan

- Participate in and support implementation of Central Maryland Regional Transit Plan.
- Establish a strong regional vision for next administration.





Workforce Connectivity

- Prioritize funding for multimodal connectivity to major workforce and distribution centers:
 - Port of Baltimore
 - BWI Airport
 - Tradepoint Atlantic
 - Port Covington
